The Natura 2000 network of protected areas

Natura 2000 denotes an EU-wide network of approximately 26'000 protected areas designed to safeguard endangered animal and plant species as well as habitats, while taken account of the sustainable development of the regions in question.


The legal basis is provided by two EU Directives (the Fauna-Flora-Habitat and the Bird Protection Directives). They commit all the member countries to designating suitable areas with a view to protecting endangered species and habitats throughout Europe and to guaranteeing their preservation by way of appropriate management.

The local Naturefriends groups are in charge of work on the ground, of spreading the word about the idea behind the nature trail projects in their regions and of organising guided walking or cycling tours to fill them with life.

Special trails through nature

From the North Sea to the Black Sea

There are more than 100 Natura Trails, most of them crossing Natura 2000 sites that form part of an EU-wide network of protected areas. The range of trails extends from leisurely walks for families via demanding mountain tours to cycling and canoeing tours, each one offering a live experience of biological diversity in unison with nature protection. The underlying idea is to follow existing trails, carefully selecting routes that bypass highly sensitive areas, such as the breeding habitats of endangered bird species.

Opportunities for eco-friendly access trips, for instance by bicycle or public transport, are also high up on the Natura Trail agenda.
