- Inequalities means of resilience
- Greenhouse gas emissions less than 4%
- Negative impacts more than 95%
- Recurrence of natural disasters and calamities
- Over 2°C / economic development undermined

- 42% endangered endemic species
- 850 endangered animal and plant species
- Loss of 0.49 % forest areas/year
- Depleted biodiversity
- Sustainable tourism on hold

- Glacier melt
- Coastal erosion
- Submergence of human settlements
- Recurrent flooding













3. PRIMARY SECTOR

- Reduction of farmland
- Long and repeated droughts
- Disappearance of mangroves/salination of land
