Naturefriends Climate Fund

Vision & Mission

The Naturefriends Climate Fund promotes climate justice by financing partnership-based projects in the Global South. In this way, it supports communities in adapting to climate change and contributing to climate protection.

All projects are implemented by Naturefriends organisations in African countries in close cooperation with the local population.

For Naturefriends in the Global North, the Climate Fund represents an opportunity to make a solidary contribution to climate justice with 100% of donations going to the project regions.

2025 Highlights



AT A GLANCE

The core of this report consists of the Climate Fund's three key projects in Senegal, Mali and Togo, focusing on tree planting and educational initiatives that have contributed to climate resilience and community development.

CHALLENGES

The climate crises poses significant challenges to communities in the Global South, particularly in regions already facing extreme weather conditions, soil degradation, and food insecurity.

SOLUTIONS

To address these challenges, tree-planting initiatives supported by the Naturefriends Climate Fund have been implemented by African Naturefriends organisations to promote environmental sustainability, economic empowerment, and community resilience.

SENEGAL: Tree Sponsorships

Since 2018, more than 16,000 fruit trees have been planted in project areas across Senegal and the Gambia. This initiative continues to grow.

The tree plantings are accompanied by ongoing awareness campaigns and hands-on community support, ensuring that the young trees are carefully maintained and have the best possible conditions to flourish.

Several years after the first trees were planted, women in participating villages celebrated the harvest of their first fruits, an important milestone demonstrating the long-term impact of the program.

To build on this progress, tree sponsorships were launched in 2023. Through these sponsorships, at least 3,500 new trees can be planted annually, while expanding the project to include more families and villages.

Tree sponsorships play a vital role in strengthening local capacities. Women and families receive training in tree cultivation, harvesting, fruit processing, and marketing, creating new income opportunities. Educational programs for children and young people are also embedded in the initiative, promoting environmental awareness and a lasting commitment to climate and nature protection.

Even under challenging ecological conditions, such as extended droughts, extreme heat, and periods of intense rainfall, continuous training and technical support help communities successfully manage and sustain their orchards. In doing so, women take on a leading role in protecting the environment while enhancing household incomes and improving local food security.

Fruit tree planting days 2025

In 2025, a reforestation initiative funded by the NFI Climate Fund was implemented in northwest and southwest Senegal to promote climate awareness and strengthen food security.

The project focused on three pilot villages: Merina Sine Ndiaye, Fordiokh, and Keur Ngor and expanded to nearby hamlets (Sékitaré, Tébéne, Keur Aly S Diaw, Keur Bam, Keur Bocar), as well as the Horticultural Training Center of Thieppe, where a new Nature-friends group was established.

Between 22 May and 1 June, the communities planted 3,150 fruit trees, including mango, lemon, cashew, and sapodilla. The selected species were chosen for their resilience to extreme climate conditions and their contribution to local nutrition and livelihoods. The project combined tree planting with education and community engagement with focus on communicating the importance of taking care of the trees.

In all villages, Naturefriends Senegal (ASAN) conducted outdoor climate workshops for 30 elementary school pupils (aged 11–13) per village. Divided into working groups, the children learned about climate change, discussed its causes and effects, and explored their role in environmental protection. They also received practical training in plant production techniques, such as seed sowing, soil preparation, and seedling care, becoming committed guardians of the trees.

Adults and youth were also actively involved through pre-planting discussions and technical training sessions on tree care, watering, pruning, and natural pest control. These activities strengthened community ownership and ensured the sustainability of the initiative.

Overall, the 2025 Fruit Tree Planting Days successfully combined environmental restoration, education, and community empowerment, reinforcing the Naturefriends network and fostering long-term climate action at the local level.

MALI: Farako tree nursery project

Likewise, the Tree Nursery Project in Farako, Mali, initiated in 2022, responds to the growing challenges posed by climate change by actively involving local schools in tree planting and environmental learning.

Located in a region heavily affected by drought, the project prioritizes the cultivation of fruit trees to enhance environmental resilience while strengthening local food supplies.

The program is structured in three stages: first, setting up a tree nursery; second, nurturing and preparing seedlings; and third, currently underway planting fruit trees within school grounds and family gardens. **Since its launch, 2,550 fruit trees have been planted across multiple villages.**

Through the engagement of students, teachers, and parents, the initiative not only improves green spaces but also builds climate awareness and promotes long-term sustainable practices within the community.

Project activities 2025

In July and August 2025, fruit tree seedlings produced at the Farako Tree Nursery became central to community-based reforestation initiatives in Mali: Within the framework of a multi-year cooperation agreement with Naturefriends International, 2ADIB-MALI / Naturefriends Mali successfully organised two fruit tree planting campaigns in Abaladougou-Kenieba and Diaramana, combining environmental action with climate education and youth mobilisation.

Abaladougou-Kenieba (Kenieba District)

Abaladougou-Kenieba, located about 130 km from Bamako near the Guinean border, was selected for its strategic importance and strong local engagement potential. A preparatory coordination meeting on 30 June ensured effective planning of logistics and activities.

A six-member delegation from Naturefriends Mali travelled to the village and collaborated with students and teachers of EL HADJI AMADOU KEITA Elementary School. Upon arrival, the team met with the school's principals and teaching staff to present the objectives of the initiative and discuss long-term care for the trees.

The programme began with a sensitisation session led by Moussa TRAORÉ, President of Naturefriends Mali, and Mamadou SOGOBA, the Treasurer. They addressed:

- The importance of environmental protection
- The impact of climate change on communities and ecosystems
- The role of youth and community participation in reforestation
- The adoption of eco-friendly behaviours in daily life



In the afternoon, the participants planted 200 fruit trees in the school courtyard: 100 mango trees and 100 orange trees. The project team provided practical guidance on watering, protection measures, and ongoing maintenance to ensure long-term survival of the trees.

Diaramana (Koutiala Region)

Following the successful campaign in Kenieba, activities continued in Diaramana, about 400 km from Bamako. On 23 August, a planting day was held at Lycée privé Kalifa Sogoba with the support of the Naturefriends Diaramana branch.

A total of 100 fruit trees - cinnamon apple, mango, orange, and guava - were planted on the school grounds. The event brought together representatives of Naturefriends Mali, local branch members, a local arborist, and pupils and youth from the community. Branch president Adama Sogoba conducted brief interviews with participants, highlighting the importance of fruit trees for shade, nutrition, improved school environments, and combating desertification. The event concluded with a message of gratitude and encouragement to take care of the trees, that were officially handed over to the local community.

The fruit tree planting campaigns in Kenieba and Diaramana, combined with the continued production work at the Farako Tree Nursery, demonstrate the strong and practical commitment of Naturefriends Mali to climate justice, youth empowerment, food security, and sustainable development. By linking environmental education with hands-on action, these initiatives strengthen local ownership and foster long-term climate resilience in Mali.

Togo: Trees for Kpalimé

Trees for Kpalimé (August 2025 – April 2027) is a two-years, community-led reforestation and environmental education project run by CASE TOGO – Amis de la Nature with the Municipality of Kpalimé. It responds to decades of forest loss in the Plateaux Region caused by agriculture, charcoal production, urban expansion and the climate crisis.

The initiative will establish a 5-hectare urban forestry park and arboretum and restore 2 hectares of riverbank forest along the Danyi River. About 5,000 trees from more than 30 native species, including endangered hardwoods (e.g., mahogany, ebony, iroko), fruit trees and fast-growing varieties, will be planted to rebuild biodiversity, cool the urban environment and protect soils and water.

Beyond planting trees, the project emphasizes education and long-term stewardship. It will train youth and volunteers in nursery management and sustainable forestry, run school awareness campaigns on climate change, produce seedlings for future restoration projects, and maintain the site through fire prevention and ecological monitoring.

Expected impact: a new accessible green space for the city of ~90,000 people, improved ecosystem health, stronger climate awareness among residents, and local capacity to continue reforestation efforts across the region.

Project activities

On 29 August 2025, Naturefriends Togo (CASE TOGO) officially launched the Arboretum Park project in Kpalimé with a public ceremony attended by authorities, NGOs, students and community members. The event featured a presentation of the project and a symbolic tree-planting activity, demonstrating strong local support. Planned as a multifunctional green space, the arboretum will serve education, research and recreation.

During the ceremony, the local representatives linked the initiative to their climate action strategy. They underlined the local impact of the climate crisis, such as reduced rainfall, rising temperatures and environmental degradation, and highlighted the importance of concrete measures such as implemented in the framework of this project.

Follow-up planting continued in September, and about 3,500 trees have already been planted under the broader Trees for Kpalimé initiative. Maintenance and monitoring will be jointly managed by the municipality and Naturefriends Togo, marking an important step toward long-term environmental restoration in the region.

An essential exchange that delivers both a warning and hope.







