The lives of people in the region are affected dramatically by climate change. Agriculture is being hampered by increasing aridity; bushfires become more frequent and woodland increasingly recedes.

The biggest emitters of greenhouse gas are industrialised and threshold countries. African countries, which only contribute to climate change to a very limited extent, suffer disproportionately from its consequences.



Landscape of the Year 2018/19

Senegal/The Gambia

An international Naturefriends campaign

Ever since 1989, Naturefriends International (NFI) has proclaimed ecologically valuable cross-border regions as "Landscape of the Year" for two or three years.

The project focuses on current challenges within the region and develops prospects for a sustainable development together with the local community. This includes the responsible use of natural resources, promotion of sustainable tourism, and initiation of cross-border cooperation.

The project coordinated by Naturefriends Senegal and their regional partners is the first Landscape of the Year on the African continent and thus takes a pioneering role, aiming to exemplify how to live international solidarity in partnership activities.

The region

The activities of the Landscape of the Year Senegal/
The Gambia will take place in the region between
the cities of Koungheul in Senegal and Janjanbureh
in The Gambia. The landscape around Koungheul is
characterized by a dry woodland savannah. Janjanbureh was built on an island in The Gambia River and
is surrounded by lush gallery forests with a rich bird
life.

In both countries, the economy is struggling with a very low level of diversification. The most important sector is agriculture, which, however, is suffering from the consequences of climate change. There is poverty among the population and food is scarce. For lack of perspectives, many people – especially young adults and women – emigrate from the region in search of a better future.

Tourism as an opportunity

Koungheul is a stop-over for tourists travelling to eastern Senegal. Many tourists visit the annual festival in Koungheul and the "Carnaval Koniagui", organised by the ethnic minority of the Koniagui. However, there is very little tourist infrastructure. In Janjanbureh, tourism currently plays a marginal role although the city and its surroundings have a lot to offer.

A gentle boost of tourism in the region could create new sources of income and contribute to combating poverty. Naturefriends will contribute in several ways, such as the creation of hiking paths to invite guests passing through to stay in the region, Naturefriends journeys and media coverage of the region's specific characteristics.
